- Berlin, November 2008
- 12 European scientific and professional societies involved in Healthcare Associated Infection (HAI)
 - conveyed that to cooperate and to share experiences is necessary in the European area (not just EU)
 - agreed not to form a new European scientific and professional society
 - proposed a formal network as the way to start a cooperation and collaboration

- In Europe many scientific and professional societies exist to support research and to promote knowledge, attitudes, good practices and training on infection prevention and control
- it respects and assumes the value of histories, traditions, activities and specificities of the existing scientific and professional societies;
- it leaves each country to evolve at its pace and to respect local characteristics;
- it retains formal contact, shares initiatives, experiences, promotes joint projects, etc.;

- it **guarantees** mutual support both for critical situations and for specific needs;
- It is **more effective** in lobbying and advocating HAI prevention at the different levels (regional, national, international);
- It is **more visible** for the media, for the public opinion and for the professional and scientific arena;
- it **makes available** to European Union, European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control, international institutions and other stake holders, a wide spread network (**common platform**) able to support work programs, guaranteeing expertise, channels of communication and feedback.

We as scientific and professional societies working in infection prevention for patient safety in Europe want to promote:

- Activities to **prevent and control infection risks** including patients and staff movement throughout Europe;
- **Engagement of politicians, caregivers and individuals** in addressing public health implications, challenges and opportunities related to infection prevention;
- **Exchange of experiences and harmonization** of activities both for professionals and “customers”;
- Be an **active partner in** promoting patient safety in Europe.

needs:**

1. Europe wide approach;

2. Greater involvement of and collaboration between:

- Politicians/governments,
- Infection prevention societies,
- Public health, academic, education and research institutions,
- Health care organizations,
- Insurance companies,
- Patients and customer organizations,

3. Networking within infection prevention professionals guaranteeing:

- Competencies,
- Education,
- Advice and support.

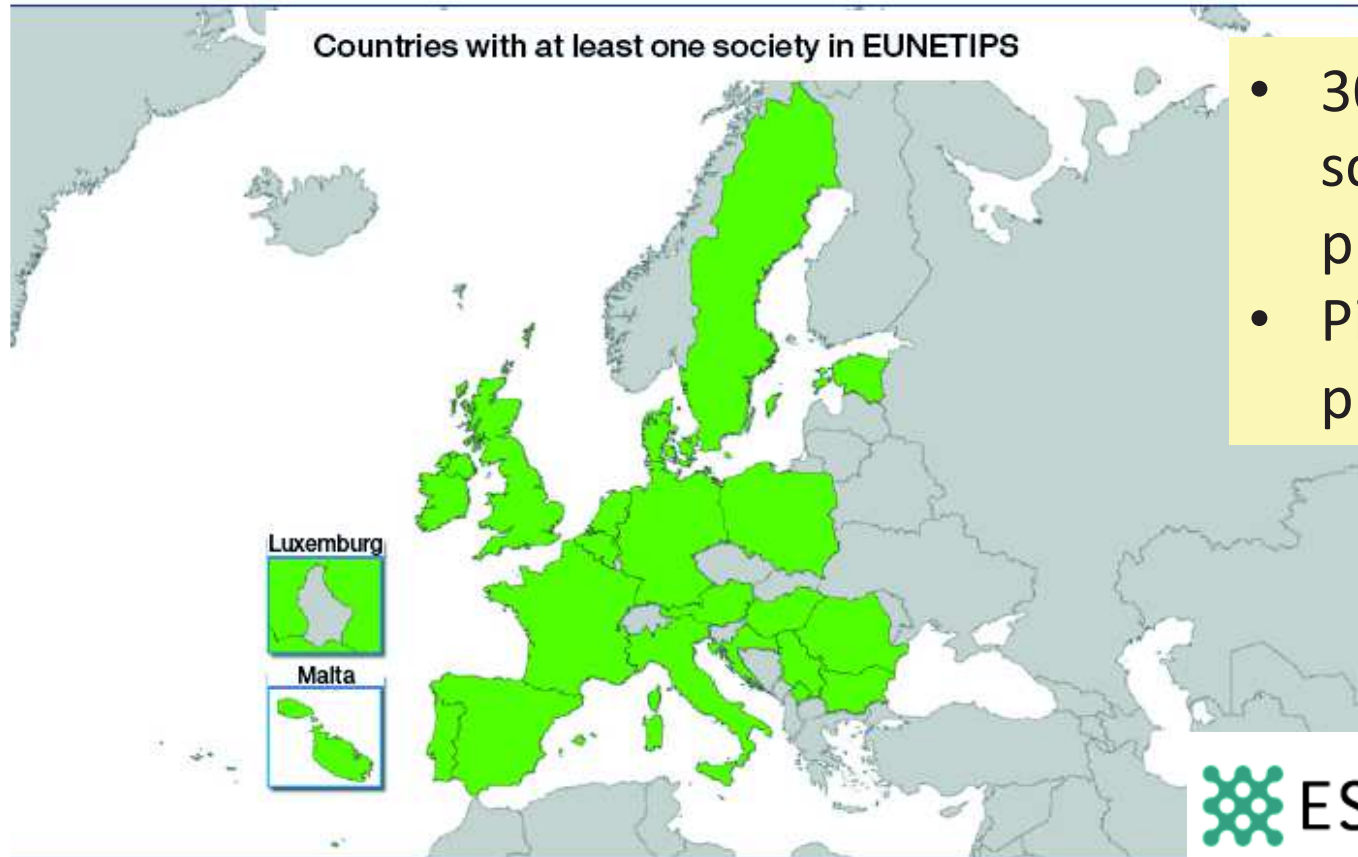
4. Particular emphasis on:

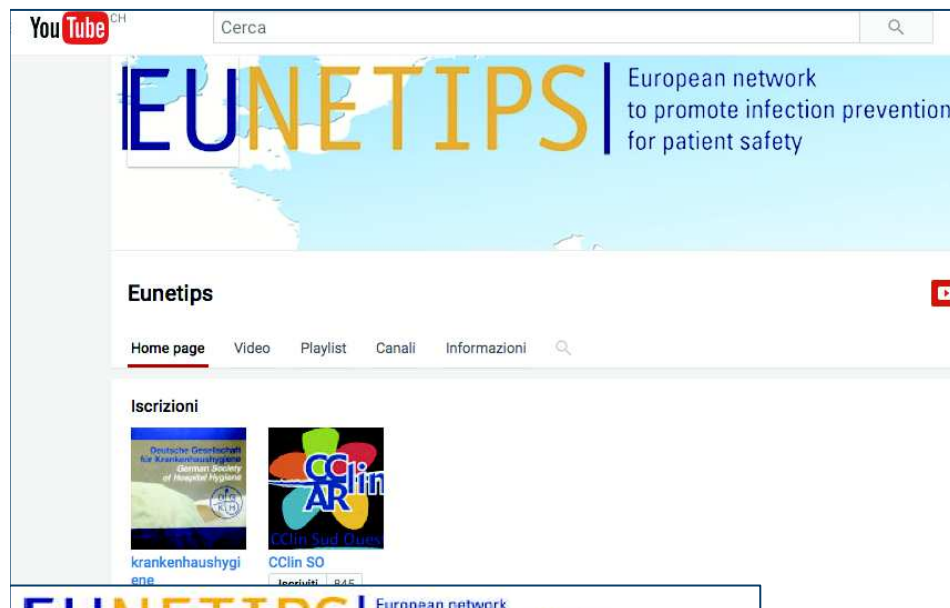

Priorities for IPC at country level

Countries where IPC has just started

- Decisive and visible political commitment, including IPC policy development and enforcement
- Availability of resources (both human and infrastructure)
- Establishment and execution of IPC programmes at the national and acute health facility levels to ensure advocacy, training and data for future improvement and sustainability
- Action to increase availability of in-country IPC knowledge and expertise

Countries with advanced IPC programmes

- Increased accountability with IPC as a quality indicator
- Development of advanced information technology tools to support IPC monitoring and implementation
- Translation of information through enhanced communications to sustain awareness and engagement
- Credible incentives considering the local context to increase compliance rates
- Enhanced education and training to embed IPC knowledge across all disciplines

Priorities for IPC at the global level

Strengthen IPC in the health system perspective

- Strengthen IPC visibility and advocacy: convince decision-makers and stakeholders
- Lead on IPC knowledge development: create standardised curricula templates that can be adapted locally (“adapt to adopt”) and stimulate further research on priority areas
- Foster and promote IPC as a marker of quality: establish international IPC minimum standards
- Build active networks and stronger communications:- ensure that patient safety and quality improvement leaders, as well as other health workers across all disciplines, are engaged to advocate for IPC

Elevate the role of IPC specifically to better combat AMR

- Strengthen the power to act: secure support for a “top-down” chief executive approach, empower IPC leads
- Improve evidence presentation to leaders: effectively outline available data and other information on the impact of IPC solutions on AMR
- Expand the narrative: help people visualise how IPC programmes can lead to AMR risk reduction

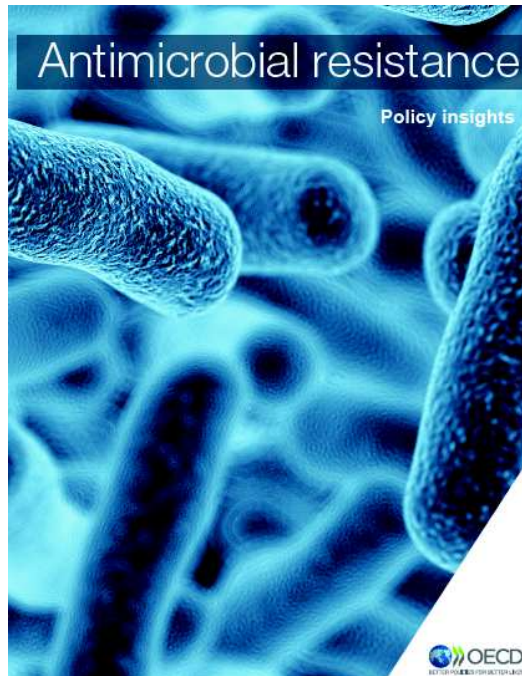

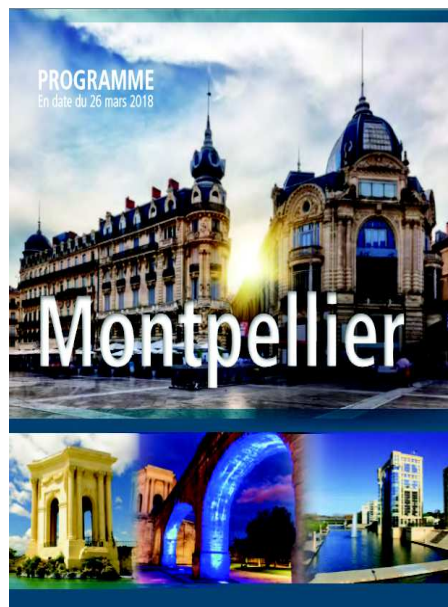

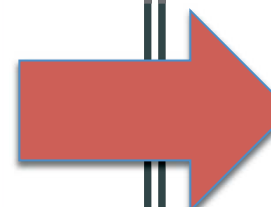
EUNETIPS is a stakeholder in the European Joint Action on Antimicrobial Resistance and Health-Care Associated Infections (JAMRAI)
